Parenting Tip of the Month Early Years Development Stages

Communication development is learning to express ourselves to communicate with others. We learn to express ourselves by learning sounds, combining those sounds into meaningful words, and putting words together into sentences to communicate our thoughts.

12 months

- Begin to say two to three words
- Responds to simple spoken requests
- Says "mama" and "dada" and exclamations like "uh-oh!"

2 years

- · Use many, even hundreds of words and gestures
- Ask many questions, "What's this? Where's my?" Ask for drinks and food
- · Says sentences with 2 to 4 words

3 years

- Children can follow simple directions, for example, "Put your shoes 'under' the table or 'beside' the door, or 'on' the mat
- · Carries on a conversation using 2 to 3 sentences
- Says first name, age, and sex

4 years

- Sing a song or says a poem from memory such as the "Itsy Bitsy Spider"
- · Can say first and last name
- Tells stories

5 years

- · Children's words are clearly understood
- Says name and address

Tells a simple story using full sentences

Seasons of the Moon

Temthéqi August 16 - September 14 Sockeye salmon time


The eleventh month, around August, is called Temthéqi - sockeye salmon time because of the run of sockeye salmon bound for the Adams River which passes the Upper Stó:lō area in August. The word sockeye comes from the Halq'emeylem word for sockeye salmon, stheqi, or the Halq'emeylem word for fish, sth'oqwi.
