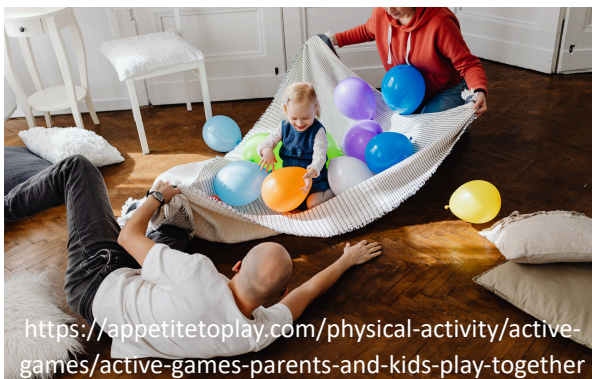

Active games for parents and children

Playing active games with your children is a fun way to bond while encouraging physical activity and creativity. Simple activities like setting up an obstacle course with household items, hosting a lively dance party where children lead the moves, or playing “keepie uppy” with a balloon can keep everyone engaged. Games such as “cat and mouse,” where players chase each other for a ribbon tail, and active scavenger hunts that blend movement and problem-solving add excitement and variety. Craft

Popsicle Stick Hot Chocolate Mug



Supplies: Jumbo Popsicle Sticks, School Glue or Hot Glue Gun, Light Blue Craft Paint, Paint Brush, Small Paper Plate -Scissors, Blue Cardstock Paper, White Cotton Balls, Snowflake Stickers

Directions:

- First, glue your popsicle sticks together to look like a fence. Eight next to each other and two across to secure in place. Set aside to let it dry completely.
- Paint your craft stick mug shape and allow it to dry
- Cut out a simple handle shape that will go on the side of the mug.
- Have children glue on the paper mug handle as well as any other embellishments, cotton ball rim of marshmallows.

Seasons of the Moon






Meqó:s - Fallen snow season

Meqó:s, December 25 - January 22 and means fallen snow season; **máqa** is fallen snow and **es** means a periodic cycle of time. This terminology is part of the Stó:lō language, which reflects the seasonal changes and natural occurrences experienced by the Stó:lō people. Stó:lō people are trapping animals such as lynx, beaver, and mink for the Winter. Snow begins to fall, signaling that Winter is here.
